**RE: Nominating Dr. Jing Zhao To Be U.S. Ambassador To Japan**

Dear President Obama:

As American and global citizens with Asian background, we are deeply concerned of the recent high tensions in East Asia involving Japan, China, both Koreas and Russia. To deal with the extremely complicated social, political, cultural and historical issues, American needs a Japan expert with human rights experience as our Ambassador to Japan, our largest alliance in Asia.

Dr. Jing Zhao is uniquely the perfect expert to serve this position to realize your Pivot to Asia policy.

Jing Zhao campaigned for free elections of student bodies in the early 1980s when he studied Nuclear Physics at Tsinghua University in Beijing. He organized Chinese students' human rights activities during the Tiananmen democratic movement in 1989 when he studied Sociology at Osaka University in Japan. He came to the U.S. as Research Fellow at Political Science Department of University of Wisconsin-Madison in 1995. As President of US-Japan-China Comparative Policy Research Institute since 2002 and Co-founder of Humanitarian China since 2007, Dr. Zhao has published hundreds of articles and twenty books (including *The US-Japan Alliance*) in Chinese, English, and Japanese. One of his essays was awarded Excellent Prize by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Japan in 1989 from the late Abe Shitaro, father of the current Japanese Prime Minister. In 1993, he was honored as "China's Conscience" for promoting democracy by Hong Kong's Democracy Alliance. In 2003, Santa Clara County honored him "Silicon Valley's Outstanding Immigrant" on "Immigrants Proud Day." He has criticized Yahoo, News Corp., Goldman Sachs, advised Intel, HP, Microsoft, and helped Google, Cisco, Chevron and others to improve their corporate social responsibility and human rights policy.

We highly recommend you nominate Dr. Jing Zhao to be our Ambassador to Japan to help promote freedom, democracy and human rights for peace, security and prosperity in Asian Pacific.
